

Child Protection Consultancy GIZ BMM Ethiopia + Djibouti Terms of Reference

Background

The objective of the Better Migration Management (BMM) program is to improve the migration management in the Eastern African region in response to the needs identified by the African countries of the Khartoum Process, and in particular to address the trafficking of human beings and the smuggling of migrants within and from the Horn of Africa. The BMM program has four components, all of which are in the midst of implementation in Ethiopia and Djibouti collectively:

- Policy harmonization
- Capacity building
- Protection
- Awareness rising

As part of the implementation of Component 3 of the BMM program focusing on the Protection of Vulnerable Migrants, GIZ has a dual role both to coordinate the activities of the implementing partners based on the agreed-upon annual work plan as well as to directly implement certain activities, particular around child protection of migrants and the human dignity of migrants.

A consultant is required to assist GIZ to effectively coordinate and implement the protection programming of Component 3 of the BMM.

Consultancy

The aim of the consultancy is to provide support to meet the agreed-upon goals for the implementation of the BMM Component 3 in Ethiopia and Djibouti. In particular, the consultant is expected to:

- Conduct a mapping of providers and a training needs assessment regarding the protection of child migrants in Ethiopia and Djibouti;
- Assist in the determination of relevant locations for child protection of migrants in Ethiopia and Djibouti based on assessed gaps in services and needs of migrant children in close coordination with the Regional Coordinator and Migration Officer;
- Research and draft a memorandum explaining the multi-disciplinary child protection team approach utilized by UNICEF in Sudan, as well as in other relevant locations by appropriate stakeholders as identified by the consultant, as regards child migrants and analyzing this approach's applicability to the Ethiopian and Djiboutian contexts;
- Help develop written understandings between GIZ and UNICEF offices in both Ethiopia and Djibouti, and potentially other partners in the child protection field, regarding cooperation, coordination, and collaboration to implement BMM Component 3 in Ethiopia and Djibouti;
- Facilitate the planned study tour for Djiboutian governmental officials to Ethiopia regarding the use of multi-disciplinary child protection teams for child migrants in Djibouti;
- Provide technical and implementation assistance to Ethiopian and/or Djiboutian CSO recipients of GIZ local subsidies related to BMM Components 2 and/or 3;
- Monitor the day-to-day implementation of any local subsidies awarded to Ethiopian and/or Djiboutian CSOs contracted to effectuate the activities in BMM Components 2 and/or 3; and
- Develop a plan for celebrating International Migrants Day in December in Ethiopia and Djibouti within the framework of BMM Component 3 and in cooperation with the Events Management Office of GIZ in Addis Ababa.

Outcomes of the consultancy:

- Mapping of child protection providers in Ethiopia and Djibouti, in separate documents by country, relevant to child migrants;
- Training needs assessment of 5-7 pages in length regarding the protection of child migrants in Ethiopia and Djibouti;
- Establishment of appropriate locations for child protection of migrants in Ethiopia and Djibouti;
- Memorandum of 3-5 pages in length on the multi-disciplinary child protection team approach as regards child migrants;
- Contribution to written understandings between GIZ and UNICEF to implement BMM Component 3 in Ethiopia and Djibouti;
- Written plan for and, time permitting, successful implementation of the planned study tour for Djiboutian governmental officials to Ethiopia regarding the use of multi-disciplinary child protection teams for child migrants in Djibouti;
- Monitoring report for the period of the consultancy of any local subsidies awarded to Ethiopian and/or Djiboutian CSOs contracted to effectuate the activities in BMM Components 2 and/or 3; and
- Written plan for the celebration of International Migrants Day in Ethiopia and Djibouti within the framework of BMM Components 2 and 3.

Working language:

- All written work for the consultancy will be delivered in English, unless otherwise directed by the Regional Coordinator.

Duration and timeframe for the consultancy:

- Timeframe: Approximately six (6) months
- Total days: 125 days
- It is expected that the consultant will be resident in Addis Ababa during the pendency of the majority of the consultancy and will be available to travel to various regional states of Ethiopia throughout the consultancy as well as to Djibouti and/or other locations in East Africa as required to meet the goals of the consultancy.

Consultancy requirements:

- Post-graduate degree in law or related subject;
- Experience working on refugee, internally displaced persons (IDPs), migration and/or other displacement issues;
- Experience working on child rights issues;
- Experience working in Ethiopia, Sudan, and/or Djibouti preferred,
- Experience working in other Sub-Saharan African countries desirable;
- Experience working for or closely with the United Nations (UN);
- At least five (5) years of relevant work experience;
- Fluency in English required, professional knowledge of French preferred as is a knowledge of relevant local languages such as Tigrinya and/or Somali; and
- Availability in September 2017.
